PADI IDC - Tobermory

Eligibility:

A PADI Divemaster who has been a certified diver for six months may enroll in the PADI IDC.

Prerequisites:

- At least 60 logged dives and 100 dives to attend an IE
- Emergency First Response Primary and Secondary Care (CPR and First Aid) training within the past 24 months
- A medical statement signed by a physician within the last 12 months

Emergency First Response Instructor is required for your IE, but you can earn this rating during your instructor training.

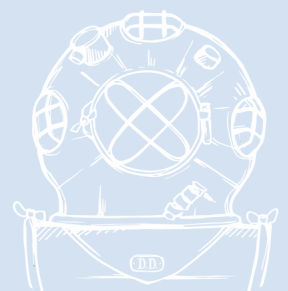

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Why should I do my IDC in Tobermory?

A: There is no question that if you plan to teach in cold water you should train in cold water. Tobermory is the “Shipwreck Diving Capital of Canada” and offers a unique destination for instructor training. Our facilities and diving locations are all a stone’s throw from each other providing convenience and efficiency. We also don’t have a pool! You’ll be doing all your confined training and examinations at The Tugs, the confined water training area located just outside the Tobermory Harbor. Training in cold water conditions provides you with the skill set to dive and teach anywhere in the world!

Q: Do I need a drysuit to dive and train in Tobermory?

A: While our water temperatures during peak season do lend themselves to wetsuits, it is imperative that you are comfortable and capable in a drysuit. Water temperatures at depth in Tobermory remain at around 4C/38F year round. In the shoulder season, the surface temperatures can easily dip down to 10C/50F. A drysuit is a critical component of your equipment if you plan to train and teach in cold water environments.

Q: What other equipment do I need for my IDC?

A: As an instructor candidate it is important that you are familiar with and own all your own equipment. This will include a drysuit, regulator, BCD, SMB & reel, flashlight, slate, mask/fins/snorkel, etc. If you have any questions about the equipment you’ll require, or are looking to purchase any of the required equipment, please contact us directly.

Q: What experience should I have to consider doing my IDC in Tobermory?

A: Instructor candidates are required to have a minimum of 100 dives in order to attend the IE. In our experience, a diver should have a minimum of 50 cold water dives (cold water being less than 50F) in order to be sufficiently comfortable in this environment to be successful in your IDC and IE.

Q: Where will I stay while I’m on course?

A: You will be staying at 100 Acre Lodge with your fellow Candidates! By immersing yourself in the experience, you will get to experience what Scuba Diving is all about. This is a team sport and by staying, playing and training with your team mates you will get the most out of these two weeks.

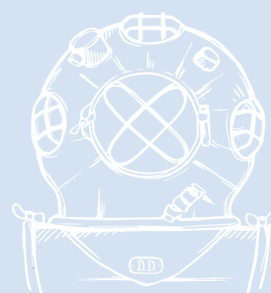
